

Burngreave Chapel Building, Melrose Road, S3 9DN Burngreave Cemetery mortuary chapel. History display and help with finding family graves. *OPEN: Fri 12th Sept 1100-1530 | Sun 14th Sept 1000-1800*

Trinity United Reformed Church, 737a Ecclesall Road, S11 8TG Opened in February 1971 it presents an uncompromising facade in the Neo-Brutalist style. The architect, J.M.M. Jenkinson RIBA was a member of the church. The church is attached to a hall that was built sixty years before. A building of contrasts, inviting exploration. *OPEN: Sat 13th Sept 1000-1600 | Sun 14th Sept 1200-1500 | Morning Worship Sun 14th Sept 1030-1200*

St John the Baptist, St John's Road, Throapham, Laughton, S25 1YL Early 13th century church. Carved stone coffin lid of around 1300. Activities include: Concert at 2pm on Saturday and brass rubbings. Children must be accompanied. *OPEN: Sat 13th Sept 1000-1600 | CONCERT: Sat 13th Sept 1400*

Lyceum Theatre, Tudor Square, S1 2LA
Theatre building fully open, with regular guided tours on a first come first serve basis. *OPEN & TOURS: Fri 12th Sept 1030-1630*

Sheffield United FC, Bramall Lane, Bramall Lane Stadium, S2 4SU Guided family tours of the stadium and its museum. *TOUR: Thurs 11th Sept 1000-1130 & 1400-1530*

Lantern Theatre, Kenwood Park Road, Nether Edge, S7 1NF
Unique small Victorian theatre originally built by local family of cutlers. Drama activities for children on the Sunday. *OPEN: Thurs 11th & Fri 12th Sept 1700-2200 | Sat 13th & Sun 14th Sept 1000-1800*

Abbeydale Picture House, 387 Abbeydale Road, S7 1FS
Guided tours, live music, local history/cinema talks, refreshments and local book sales. Displays of groups involved. *OPEN: Sat 13th & Sun 14th Sept 1000-1600*

Weston Park Heroes, The Bandstand, Weston Park, Western Bank Promenade performance in one of Sheffield's oldest parks with characters relating to the history of the recently full restored park. *PERFORMANCE: Sun 14th Sept 1400-1500*

Wortley Hall Gardens, Wortley Village, S35 7DB 26 acres of Italianate gardens, with sunken garden, lake with ice house and ancient oak tree some 500 years old. Guided tours with the Head Gardener include the Stable Block and the organic kitchen garden. *OPEN: Thurs 11th, Fri 12th, Sat 13th, Sun 14th Sept 0930-1600 | TOURS: Thurs 11th, Fri 12th, Sun 14th Sept 1400 | Sat 13th Sept 1000*

Sheffield Botanical Gardens Guided Tour, Clarkehouse Road, S10 2LN Opened in 1836, covering 19 acres, designed by Robert Marnock. Contains fifteen different garden areas and several listed buildings including the restored Grade II* listed curvilinear Glass Pavilions. *TOUR: Thurs 11th Sept 1400-1530*

CITY LANDMARKS

Leader House, Surrey Street, S1 2LH 18th century survivor of the Blitz and plans of demolition. Rare guided tour opportunity. Pre-book via eric.hildrew@sheffieldgalleries.org.uk | 0114 2782624. TOUR: Thurs 11th & Fri 12th Sept 1400

The Town Hall, Pinstone Street, S1 2HH
Opened in 1897, Sheffield Town Hall is a Grade I listed building and an example of fine Victorian civic architecture with a 64 metre clock tower and grand civic rooms. OPEN: Sun 14th Sept 1000-1600

Firth Court - University of Sheffield, Western Bank, S10 2TN
Built in 1905, Grade II listed building. School of Architecture, based in Firth Court in 1908 is celebrating its centenary this year. OPEN: Fri 12th Sept 1400-1700

Sheffield Cathedral, Church Street, S1 1HA One of the oldest buildings in daily use in Sheffield. Expert guided tours available throughout weekend. OPEN: Thurs 11th, Fri 12th, Sat 13th Sept 0830-1830 | Sun 14th Sept 1200-1945 | TOURS: Thurs 11th, Fri 12th, Sat 13th Sept 1030 & 1415 | Sun 14th Sept 1400

Park Hill Estate, Bard Street Community Centre, off Duke St
Presentations and exhibition on the major refurbishment of this largest Grade II* listed building in the country. OPEN: Thurs 11th Sept 1400-1730

INDUSTRIAL HERITAGE

Furnace Fun Day, Kelham Island Museum, Alma Street, S3
Free entry to rarely seen old steel-making furnaces with talks, guided tours, nostalgic films of the area, children's activities, displays of local archaeological finds and maps, local musicians and Punch and Judy. Costumed characters will explain how steel was made in the old furnaces. OPEN: Sun 14th Sept 1100 - 1600

Sterling Works & Butcher Works, 88 Arundel Street, S1 2NG
18th century Grade II* building recently restored to create a new exhibition space, café, and traditional cutlery workshops. Used today by the Freeman College, Ruskin Mill Educational Trust. Participatory hand spoon forging and craft makers demonstrations will be available. OPEN: Sat 13th Sept 1100-1600

Shepard Wheel Public Open Day, Whitely Woods, Sheffield
A water powered grinding workshop located on the River Porter. The site is a Grade II listed building and a Scheduled Ancient Monument. OPEN: Sun 14th Sept 1030-1530

Stocksbridge - A History of the Steel Valley The ARC (Old Town Hall), Manchester Road, Stocksbridge, S36 2DT A guided walk around Stocksbridge visiting steel heritage landmarks and features, including the railway, the old offices, the Steel Valley Walk, ganister mine remains and Victorian buildings. WALK: Thurs 11th Sept 1000-1300

Rivelin Bank Booster Pumping Station, Rivelin Bank Unique diesel pumping station running at full load, built 1942 with original equipment supplying water to city during wartime. Still in full working order and laid dormant 35 years. Able to pump approx 100,000 galls per hour. OPEN: Sun 14th Sept 1100-1700

LOCAL HISTORY

Norfolk Heritage Trail, Manor Lodge, 115 Manor Lane, S2 1UH Guided walk along the Norfolk Heritage Trail calling at: Manor Lodge, Castle Ruins, City Road Cemetery, Norfolk Heritage Park, Clay Wood, Cholera Monument, Shrewsbury Hospital (Alms Houses), Sweet Factory, Park Hill, Sheffield Castle Ruins, Queens Head Pub, Sheffield Cathedral. The trail is 2.75 miles long and is mainly down hill. Meet at Sheffield Manor Lodge. As the trail finishes in town it is better to come by public transport. WALK: Thurs 11th, Fri 12th & Sat 13th Sept 1100-1500

A Guided Walk The Domesday Village of Ughill, Ughill Water Monument, Hoarstones Road, S6 An easy 90 minute walk looking at listed buildings and others of historical interest in the ancient village/hamlet of Ughill - led by local historian. Pre-Booking required on 0114 2337463 WALK: Sat 13th Sept 1000

Sheffield General Cemetery, The Gatehouse, Cemetery Avenue, S11 8NT Second oldest in the country with 9 listed buildings and monuments. Activities include: Tales From the Vault, Sudden Death Tour, refreshments, bookstall and information from Sheffield General Cemetery Trust. OPEN: Sun 14th Sept 1200-1600

Bishops' House, Norton Lees Lane, S8 9BE Over 500 years old, Bishops' House is a living, breathing time capsule. Discover life in Tudor England, explore Bishops' House Family History Quest and join in art activities to design an outfit for Henry VIII or Elizabeth I. Walk in nearby Mersbrook and Graves parks. OPEN: Sat 13th & Sun 14th Sept 1100-1630

Sheffield Transport Rally, Meadowhall Coach Park Vintage buses, coaches, lorries and cars. A free bus service to South Yorkshire Transport Museum, Aldwarke, Rotherham. OPEN: Sun 14th Sept 1100-1600

FAITH

St William of York Church, Ecclesall Road, S11 8TL Roman Catholic Church renovated and reordered in 1970. OPEN: Sat 13th Sept 1000-1600

St Paul's Parish Church, Wordsworth Avenue, Parson Cross, S5 9FP Grade II* listed Parish church Built in 1959 and designed by Basil Spence. OPEN: Sat 13th Sept 1000-1400 | Sun 14th Sept 0900-1200

St Joseph's Catholic Church, St Joseph's Road, Handsworth, S13 8AT Grade II listed church built in 1881 with spectacular stations of the cross. OPEN: Sat 13th & Sun 14th Sept 1130-1600

Upper Chapel - Unitarian, Norfolk Street, S1 2JD Grade II listed, 18th century chapel with magnificent Henry Holliday stained glass windows, impressive organ and ornate ceiling. Displays, organ recitals and a Traidcraft Stall. OPEN: Thurs 11th, Fri 12th & Sat 13th Sept 1100-1600

St Saviour's Church, Mortomley Lane, High Green, S35 4HS
This church is a memorial to Parkin Jeffcock, killed in the Oaks Colliery Disaster of 1866. It was opened in 1872 and reordered in 1995-2005 OPEN: Sat 13th Sept 1000-1600 | Sun 14th Sept 1200-1600

St Peter's Church, Reney Avenue, Greenhill, S8 7FN A modern distinctive 'church in the round' built c1965. Remarkable example of modern stained glass. OPEN: Fri 12th Sept 0900-1230 | Sat 13th Sept 0900-1600 | Sun 14th Sept 07.45-1230

St John's Penistone Church, Shrewsbury Road, Church Street, Penistone Dates from 12th century and includes remains of a Saxon cross. History quizzes for church interior and Sensory Garden will be available. OPEN: Thurs 11th, Fri 12th, Sat 13th Sept 1000-1600

St Andrew's Psalter Lane Church, Psalter Lane, S11
Recently reordered, with stained glass window by Rona Moody, entitled 'The New Creation Window'. Open for viewing throughout the weekend, with information and refreshments available. OPEN: Sat 13th Sept 1000-1600 | Sun 14th Sept 1200-1600

Beauchief Abbey, Beauchief Abbey Lane, Off Abbey Lane, S8 0DB Grade II* remains of a 12th century Praemonstratensian Abbey, founded in memory of Thomas-a-Becket, with 17th century chapel which has original box pews. Tours and history displays. OPEN: Sat 13th Sept 1000-1700 | Sun 14th Sept 1300-1700
